Wastewater

The amount of water you use, how dirty it gets, and how it is treated





Solid Waste

The amount of trash you generate and how you dispose of it



Light Pollution

The amount of light emitted into the environment at night





Landscaping

The type of landscaping and permeability of the soil

QUICK TIPS



Get to know your system - find the access to your grease trap, septic tank, aerobic filter and drainage field.



Keep chemicals and oils out of your water and use natural, biodegradable products.



Keep track of your maintenance schedule:

- ·→ Clean your septic tank every 3 years (always leave a bit as to not destroy the important bacteria)
- ·→ Clean your grease trap every 3 months



Keep the area around your septic tank clear of large trees and impermeable surfaces.



Don't flush anything that won't disintegrate if you shake it in a bottle full of water. In some cases (especially older constructions) you can't flush toilet paper at all and you should upgrade your system.



Conserve water! Install water efficient fixtures such as dual flush toilets and water saving showers. Switch to drip irrigation, check for and fix leaks.

















DID YOU KNOW?

Only 15% of wastewater is treated in Costa Rica and it's up to you to treat yours!

These are the types of solid waste you produce and how to dispose of them





Put them in a non-transparent bag and place it in your bin





Recyclables

Clean and separate them in a clear transparent bag and place it on top of your bin the night before the pickup









Organic waste

Keep organic waste out of your trash. Compost it or bury it in your yard! Don't throw it in the jungle or you'll attract wildlife





QUICK TIPS



Make sure you are up-to-date with your property taxes and place your trash bin along the pickup route.



Learn more about recycling: pick-up schedules and routes, collected materials and volunteering opportunities in the area.



Trash bins should be made of cement or metal wire mesh to prevent wildlife from tearing bags open.



Skip the plastic bottles! Install a water filter or purchase a water dispenser in a returnable bottle.



Purchase products in returnable glass or recyclable containers only. Even better, buy in bulk and use refillable containers!



Use a set of reusable grocery bags (available in most supermarkets).

THE GOOD NEWS IS...

Costa Rica uses 100% renewable energy but you still have ways of reducing your impact (and your bills)



QUICK TIPS



Keep it shielded

Use shielded lights and cutoff fixtures, trees and vegetation to direct light downward. Close curtains and blinds.



Keep it long

Use longer wavelengths of light: red, amber or yellow bulbs.



Keep it low

Use a low mounting height, downlighting and lower bulb wattage or amber LEDs.




Keep it efficient

Don't leave your lights on all night!
Use motion-sensor lights instead.
Use AC unit with a timer or smart controller and upgrade to energy efficient appliances whenever possible.



DID YOU KNOW?

Light pollution affects nocturnal wildlife, especially nesting sea turtles and hatchlings.











LANDSCAPING BASICS

HABITAT CONNECTIVITY is key for wildlife. You can plan your landscape to help build a more connected and resilient environment!















Avoid cutting trees at all cost! They will reduce light pollution and runoff from your property, provide shade to cool the space and habitat for wildlife.



Build on less than 50% of your lot to allow runoff and wastewater to infiltrate the ground, preventing runoff and land erosion.



Use a wire, mesh, or living fence around your property that allows wildlife to cross through and enables habitat connectivity.



Plant a variety of native plants and trees. These require less water in the dry season and flowers will attract butterflies, hummingbirds and a great variety of biodiversity to your garden!



Use gravel or open grid concrete blocks for driveways and paths to allow water to filter through the surface.



Don't use pesticides, herbicides or fungicides. Sprinkle some Diatomaceous Earth powder as an all-around natural insect deterrent.




Use drip irrigation or install rain barrels to collect rainwater for watering in the dry season.



DID YOU KNOW?

Some areas of Nosara have low ground permeability and flood frequently in the rainy season.
